#### **1ST READING** Ephesians 4:25-5:2 (The Message, revised for gender inclusivity)

- <sup>25</sup> What this adds up to, then, is this: no more lies, no more pretense. Tell your neighbor the truth. In Christ's body we're all connected to each other, after all. When you lie to others, you end up lying to yourself.
- <sup>26-27</sup> Go ahead and be angry. You do well to be angry—but don't use your anger as fuel for revenge. And don't stay angry. Don't go to bed angry. Don't give the Devil that kind of foothold in your life.
- <sup>28</sup> Did you use to make ends meet by stealing? Well, no more! Get an honest job so that you can help others who can't work.
- <sup>29</sup> Watch the way you talk. Let nothing foul or dirty come out of your mouth. Say only what helps, each word a gift.
- <sup>30</sup> Don't grieve God. Don't break God's heart. God's Holy Spirit, moving and breathing in you, is the most intimate part of your life, making you fit for God. Don't take such a gift for granted.
- <sup>31-32</sup> Make a clean break with all cutting, backbiting, profane talk. Be gentle with one another, sensitive. Forgive one another as quickly and thoroughly as God in Christ forgave you.
- 5 1-2 Watch what God does, and then you do it, like children who learn proper behavior from their parents. Mostly what God does is love you. Keep company with God and learn a life of love. Observe how Christ loved us. His love was not cautious but extravagant. He didn't love in order to get something from us but to give everything of himself to us. Love like that.

This sanctuary is equipped with Hearing Loop technology. Ask a deacon about them or find them in the basket by the Loop sign.
